First things first

Every community or developer has a site or project that gives them grief. It might not fit neatly into the typical development approach "box." It might have peculiar physical constraints. It might not be attractive to large entities that are looking for particular sites. Or, it might be tied to a controversial civic redevelopment issue.

These are sites ideal for testing a different model.

Collaborate with us. Whether it's a small site of up to 20 acres or an entire neighborhood, we have an approach to working together.

First, an important caveat: none of these options are full-blown, public involvement processes. Anything of that nature truly needs a larger team, a longer timeline and a bigger budget. Instead, these are quick-hitting studies that evaluate your site, inspire your team and can be tools for further education. Our process works by collaborating with your team directly for three to four intense days, and wrapping up with a valuable work product that immediately cements your leadership role. The timeline from contract to finish is no more than 120 days. We aim to empower our clients with high-quality, inspiring, detailed information that is implementable in the real world.









Service Options

Our "prix fixe" model is unique in the world of planning and urban design. The options outlined here tell you exactly what we will deliver for a specfiic fee. There's no guessing and no back-and-forth proposal process.

Whether you're a developer, a quasigovernmental authority or a local government that controls some land, this menu of services is meant for you.

For local governments or citizens that also wish to specifically explore a different approach to redevelopment and site-specific urban design, we'll give you the highest-quality design and compelling analysis.

As noted, none of these are full-blown public involvement processes. The "Lite" package, our lowest-cost option, in fact involves us working remotely from our offices in Kansas City. The "Large" option includes some public and stakeholder involvement, but is very limited and targeted.

Optional Add-ons

In addition to the three base options, we provide four possible additions to any contract. None of the additions will extend the contract time, but they add additional deliverables and fee.

Option 1: A Public Presentation by Kevin. \$1,500

Kevin is an experienced public speaker for issues related to planning and economic development. He can give a presentation open to the public on this model and approach, called "The Value of Messy Cities."

Option 2: Add a Transportation Planner to the team. \$10,000

This option only extends to the Small and Medium plans, since one is already included in the Large plan. We can add an experienced transportation planner should there be a key transportation issue that needs to be solved.

Option 3: Add a Specialist to the team: \$10,000

Occasionally, there's a desire to add a category of specialist or a bit more depth beyond our core team to a project. A specific issue might need to be addressed that requires critical expertise. This could be a Landscape Architect, a Developer, or a Market Analyst, for example.

Option 4: Better Block / Tactical Urbanism Demonstration: \$10,000

Work with the experienced crew at Better Block KC to demonstrate a critical public space or street design idea as part of the planning effort.
